
- **1.** Measure width of door opening from jamb to jamb and stop to stop and mark ends of threshold for trimming.
- 2. Trim ends of threshold to fit around door jambs and stops.
- **3.** Drill pilot holes in floor through pre-drilled holes in threshold.
- **4.** Caulk ends of threshold, and under full length of legs (important for effective sealing and moisture control).
- **5.** Secure threshold to floor with supplied screws. (When fastening to concrete, use anchors; anchors not included.)
- **6.** Caulk the edges of the recessed channel where the snap cover legs will sit (this will mitigate any potential chatter.)
- 7. Lay snap cover into position on threshold.
- **8.** Using a wood block and a rubber mallet, secure snap cover in place.

Testing/Ratings:

Gasketing material for fire doors intended for application to listed steel frames and/or classified steel covered composite type, and hollow metal type fire doors rated up to 3 hours; wood and plastic covered composite type fire doors rated up to $1^{1}/_{2}$ hours; and wood core type fire doors rated up to 20 minutes.

(Thresholds may or may not contain gasketing material).
